Mary H. Kosmidis, Ph.D. is a Professor of Neuropsychology and the Director of the Lab of Cognitive Neuroscience in the School of Psychology at Aristotle University of Thessaloniki in Greece. She received her Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology in the US and worked as a staff fellow at the NIMH. Her undergraduate and graduate teaching focuses on neuropsychology, assessment and rehabilitation, including clinical supervision of graduate students. She has organized a number of educational and academic activities on a national and international level, including conferences, seminars, workshops, and the Vivian Smith Advanced Studies Institute of the International Neuropsychological Society. She has also served as an expert evaluator of grant proposals for national and international funding agencies. Her research interests include investigation of the pathophysiology of neurological and psychiatric disorders through the study of dysfunctional cognitive mechanisms and their implications for optimal intervention, cognitive correlates of illiteracy, early signs of cognitive decline among the elderly and protective factors, and cross-cultural issues in neuropsychological assessment, as well as test development/adaptation. She has published three original books in Greek, 12 book chapters and over 100 scientific journal articles and has edited the Greek translation of six scientific books. Her research has been awarded with several grants and conference prizes.

She is a researcher at the Neuropsychological Laboratory of the 1st Neurology Department of the NKUA and a Clinical Research Collaborator at the Neurology Department and the Memory Clinic of the Henry Dunant Hospital Center. Her research interests include the executive function construct, the cognitive status of clinical entities of fronto-striatal pathology, test development/adaptation, Public health and Health economics. She is a Founding Member and the Secretary General of the Hellenic Neuropsychological Society since its foundation (2014), a Regular Member of the Association of Greek Psychologists and a Regular Member of the International Neuropsychological Society.





Located on Thessaloniki's waterfront, the Thessaloniki Concert Hall has become a reference point for residents and visitors and is an asset for the city's architectural profile.

Thessaloniki Concert Hall Organisation is the owner of 2 Buildings (M1 & M2) of unique architecture situated on the waterfront at the "Nea Paralia" area of Thessaloniki. The double function of Thessaloniki Concert Hall as host of both musical events and conventions covers the need for an art, science and business activities' centre, worthy of the city's rich cultural past and its great perspective.

The Convention and Cultural Centre has more than 20 venues, all of which are equipped with audiovisual facilities, while interactive presentation instruments can be supplied on demand. The Halls' venues are ideal for hosting a variety of events that range from music concerts and operas to opening ceremonies and international conventions; from round-table meetings workshops and presentations.

The Thessaloniki Concert Hall is designed to offer optimum sufficiency and functionality. Underneath the Hall lies a two-level underground parking lot of 11.800 sqm, in order to enable the organization and attendance of events. Furthermore it offers a number of auxiliary spaces to enable carrying out an event. All of the Hall's spaces are accessible to individuals with limited mobility. Designed by the renowned architect Arata Isozaki, M2 adorns the city with a unique construction that epitomizes the virtues of modern architecture. Geometrical lines, extended glass surfaces and elements of steel compose an image of imposing simplicity that contrasts with, yet complements, the neighbouring M1, which is mainly built from red brick, inspired by the Roman and Byzantine monuments.

The Complex is accessible by public bus and is located only a few minutes from the city centre. The pedestrian route on the waterfront is a great option for a sunny day.

- **5 km** from the Port









MAKEDONIA PALACE

Metropolitan Hotel, 3*

Thessaloniki City Tour

Explore a history of 2300 years through a city tour in Thessaloniki. Wandering through the city, it is worthwhile to pass through the Byzantine Walls and have a panoramic view of Thessaloniki from the Trigonion or Chain Tower located at the northeast of the city; visit Agios Dimitrios church (5th c. AD) a splendid basilica dedicated to the patron saint and protector of the city. There one can see stunning Byzantine mosaics and the Crypt, where the saint met a martyr's death by the Roman soldiers. In the end of the tour, our guide will lead participants to the Archaeological or the Museum of Byzantine Culture of Thessaloniki.





Vergina-Veria- Naoussa Tour

The archaeological site at Vergina testifies to the culture of the Macedonian kingdom. The site contains the ruins of the royal family's summer palace, where, in later years, Philip II was assassinated and buried. The discovery of his tomb in 1977 was hailed as one of the greatest archaeological finds of the century. Rich and impressive artefacts were unearthed and can be viewed there along with the tombs themselves and the amazing frescoes, rare samples of painting from antiquity.

After an hour's drive from Thessaloniki, by coach, we will visit Vergina, the museum of Vergina and the ancient royal tombs of Philip, the King of Macedonia and father of Alexander the Great. Veria will be our next stop, a picturesque town with a unique landscape and architecture. We will drive through the city, see St. Paul's Altar, take a rest and enjoy a coffee at a traditional café and walk for a while through the lovely streets of the city, full of old Byzantine churches and unique historical monuments.

Naoussa is the next stop: visit to one of the most well-known wineries in Greece. Guided tour to the production facilities and cellars, multi-media presentation on the history of wine-making in Naoussa and wine tasting session. Rich lunch in the winery restaurant accompanied by special wines.

Mount Olympus: Mountaineering on the abode of the Gods

This tour will take you to the footsteps of Mt. Olympus; also known as the "home of Gods". Olympus, with a height of 2918 m, is the highest mountain in Greece, second in the Balkan Peninsula and home of the 12 Olympic Gods. Eternal snow covers the peak of this mountain range with four different zones of vegetation, amazing fauna and flora, medieval monasteries and hiking and climbing paths leading to the peak which was conquered for the first time by the famous photographer Frederic Boissonnas, Daniel Baud-Bovy and Christos Kakalos.

This excursion includes also a visit to Dion, the religious centre of the Macedonians, where the mythical 12 Olympic Gods were worshipped. For our lunch break we will arrive in the beautiful village of Litochoro. A chance to breathe the fresh mountain air, admire the natural beauty, whilst walking through unspoiled forest of the Ainipeas Valley. One of the best rated restaurants in the country located in Litochoro is going to offer us a taste trip to the local delicatessens.

Mount Athos Boat Tour

Southeast of Thessaloniki is Mount Athos or “Aghion Oros”, a unique place to visit. The “Holy Mountain” has been an autonomous monastic state since the 11th century by order of an Imperial Byzantine decree. It still enjoys a special status of autonomy within the Greek State.

Having reached Ormos Panagias, by coach, we will board the ship for a cruise around the coastline of the monastic republic of Athos. The cruise around Mount Athos is a wonderful combination of knowledge and pleasure. We will have the chance to enjoy the view of the beautiful scenery and the Byzantine monasteries of exceptional and unique architecture. According to regulations we will have to maintain a distance of 500 metres from the shore during the entire cruise. From the bridge of the ship, a tour guide will explain the historical background and give a full description of the Monasteries, helping us get more familiar with the landscape and the history of the world-wide unique peninsula. The cruise ends as we cross back to Ouranoupolis where we will stop for lunch in a Greek taverna. From there, the boat and the coach will take us back to Thessaloniki.





Greece is also a member of the International Monetary Fund and the World Trade Organisation.

The climate is typically Mediterranean over most of the country, with warm-to-hot summers and mild winters. Usually, especially in the south of the country, there is little or no rain in the summer. Only some of the wettest locations at high elevations have more than 100 days of rain per year.

Economy

Greece belongs to the high-income countries according to the World Bank list of economies (July 2015). A developed country, the economy of Greece revolves mainly around the service sector and industry. Important Greek industries include tourism (it is ranked as the 16th most visited country in the world by the United Nations World Tourism Organisation) and merchant shipping (the Greek merchant marine fleet is the largest in the world), while the country is also a considerable agricultural producer within the Union. As the largest economy in the Balkans, Greece is also an important regional investor.

History & culture

In regard to history, Greece is widely considered as the cradle of Western Civilization. A large number of written works that have influenced the thinking of science and philosophy for more than 2500 years, as well as a huge number of antiquities, either in beautiful archaeological sites or in extremely rich museums, testify on the importance of the ancient Greek civilization. The Athenian democracy which was founded in 507 BC, is one of ancient Greece's most enduring contributions to the modern world. Modern Greece is a parliamentary republic based on the separation and balancing of legislative, executive and judicial powers.

The Greek people have a very rich culture which in addition to the Ancient Greek culture roots has also incorporated many elements from the various people who have passed, either in peace or as invaders, from



the country that lies at the crossroads between Europe, Asia and Africa. Greek people are friendly, helpful and hospitable. The educational level is high with most young people being able to communicate in English in addition to Greek which is their mother language. French, German and Spanish speaking people are also quite common.

Today's visitors to Greece have the opportunity to trace the "fingerprints" of Greek history from the Paleolithic Era to the Roman Period in the hundreds of archaeological sites, as well as in the archaeological museums and collections that are scattered throughout the country. Numerous monuments from the Byzantine Years and the Ottoman Occupation Period have as well been preserved.

Greece is a true paradise for cultural tourism, a large journey into history and art. Educational excursions, theatrical productions, festivals, pilgrimages, visits to archaeological sites, monuments and museums, excursions to study the natural environment, folk art and culture – these are just a few of the many things that Greece has to offer. Folk culture for the Greek people, rich in music, dances, poetry and theatre is part of their everyday life. All over the country a large number of specialized museums and cultural organisations aim to preserve and foster the study the Greek traditional heritage.


